LESSON PLAN

1. Direct Instruction

Demonstrate **D** on the Slate Chalkboard or Gray Blocks. Say the words for each step.

Lesson D:



Start in the Big Line down Starting Corner



Frog Jump



Big Curve to the bottom

2. Guided Practice

Children finger trace step-by-step models on the page while saying the words.

Children trace D.

Children copy **D**.

3. Check Letter

Monitor as children trace and copy letters for correct start and steps.

READ, COLOR & DRAW

Read DOLPHIN. Say **D** and make the /d/ sound. Encourage free coloring and drawing. Add water, other dolphin, etc.

ENRICHMENT


D is for day. Let children say "day" after you start saying the days of the week: Mon____, Tues____, etc.


SUPPORT/ELL
